SUMMER PROGRAMS DESIGNED TO HELP ALL STUDENTS THRIVE

DPS OFFERS ROBUST SUMMER LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS.



For the first time, the Dayton Public School District is offering a robust array of summer learning opportunities for students of all grade levels. From preparing the youngest learners for kindergarten, instilling a love of STEM, and transitioning 8th graders to high school, there is a program designed to fit every student's needs.

These programs were thoughtfully planned and developed in an effort to prevent summer learning loss and ensure all students have engaging and exciting learning opportunities throughout June and July.

While programs will certainly help enhance a student's academic skills, the programs will also offer field trips, enrichment activities, college visits, and other fun opportunities.

Although many programs are at capacity, we invite families to sign students up for the programs listed here that still have open seats.

High School Summer Bridge Programs

These programs are designed to ensure a positive transition to high school, help students build a strong foundation for success, understand graduation requirements, and expose students to various college and career pathways they might be interested in pursuing.

- July 8th-July 19th: Belmont, Meadowdale, and Stivers.
- July 22nd-August 2nd: Dunbar, Thurgood (& International School students), and Ponitz.
- The program will take place between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m., Monday-Friday.
- Transportation will be provided to students who qualify.

Ready, Set, Grow! Kindergarten Readiness Program

This program is designed to set incoming kindergarteners up for success. Students will receive transportation and enjoy creative crafts, themed weekly activities, hands-on learning, and more!

- June 10th-June 28th at Rosa Parks Early Learning Center from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m., Monday-Friday.

Elementary Summer Institute - Office for Cultural Engagement & Inclusion

This program involves a series of sessions designed to affirm, enlighten, and inspire young students in grades 4-6.

- June 3rd-June 14th at Meadowdale Career Technology Center from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Monday-Friday.

Middle School Summer Intensive - Office for Cultural Engagement & Inclusion

This program will provide hands-on experiences in math and science, mentorship, leadership development, and a focus on high school and college readiness for students in grades 7-8.

FREE MEALS FOR CHILDREN

SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM PROVIDES FREE MEALS THROUGHOUT JUNE AND JULY.

Free meals are available to:

- All children 18 years of age and under, or
- Those over 18 determined by a state or local public educational agency to be mentally or physically disabled AND who participate during the school year in a public or private nonprofit school program established for the mentally or physically disabled.

DPS meal sites include: Belmont High School, Charity Adams Earley Girls Academy, Cleveland Elementary, Paul Laurence Dunbar High School, Edwin Joel Brown Middle School, Fairview Elementary, The International School at Residence Park, Kiser Elementary, Meadowdale CTC, Ponitz CTC, Roosevelt Elementary, Rosa Parks Early Learning Center, Ruskin Elementary, Stivers School for the Arts, Thurgood Marshall STEM High School, Westwood Elementary, and Wogaman Middle School.
