## Why Choose The International School?

In the Dayton Public School District, more than 15% of the student population consists of students who have a home or native language other than English. Of those students, many are newcomers experiencing their first years of schooling in the United States. If given the foundational tools to succeed early on, these newcomer students can reach their full potential academically, and will be well-prepared to enter college or a career after high school.

The International School at Residence Park is designed to welcome students of all grade levels who are new to the United States and need extra English language support. Skilled teachers and bilingual staff will help students gain the foundational skills they need to excel in English, mathematics, and other subject areas. The school is also designed to help students and families become acquainted with American culture, customs, and the educational system. The school plans to offer adult English classes and other community services at the building as well.

Students will spend an average of one year at the school before integrating back into their neighborhood schools. The exact length of time a newcomer student spends at the school will depend on how much extra language support he or she needs to access academic subjects.

In addition to newcomer students, the building houses K-6 students from the Residence Park neighborhood. DPS busing to The International School is available to students in grades K-8.
